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Standard Chartered Arts in the Park 2018 Returns to Causeway Bay on 3 & 4 November Featuring giant illuminated puppets and more inspired by *The Wizard of Oz*



(Hong Kong, 28 October 2018) – "Toto, I've a feeling we're not in Kansas anymore." This November, the legendary tornado carries Dorothy, Toto, the Scarecrow, the Tin Man, the Cowardly Lion and other favourite characters from *The Wizard of Oz* all the way from Kansas to Hong Kong to celebrate *Standard Chartered Arts in the Park 2018*!

Organised by Hong Kong Youth Arts Foundation, sponsored by Standard Chartered Community Foundation and powered by Standard Chartered Bank (Hong Kong) Limited, *Standard Chartered Arts in the Park* marks its 18th edition this year. The two-day spectacle is packed with 7 exciting main events inspired by *The Wizard of Oz*, including Hong Kong's largest Night Parade featuring giant illuminated puppets, a spectacular Grand Finale Parade, live performances, live storytelling, African drum jams, 16 free-of-charge art stalls, non-stop stage performances, plus this year's special new event, The Emerald City Best Outfit Contest.

Standard Chartered Arts in the Park is a free-of-charge annual public event that attracts on average more than 180,000 local residents and foreign visitors each year. This year, follow your own Yellow Brick Road and join us for a sensational weekend of visual and sensorial art experiences for all ages!

Giant Puppet Parades in Causeway Bay

The spectacular giant puppet parades are two of the most anticipated events at *Standard Chartered Arts in the Park*. This year, the **Night Parade** takes place on 3 November (Saturday). Starting at Lee Garden One, at 8:30pm, the parade winds its way through Yun Ping Road, Pak Sha Road and Kai Chiu Road to Hysan Place and back. During the event, artists from Hong Kong and the UK-based Lantern Company will light up the streets with 7 mesmerising giant illuminated puppets and 7 groups of accompanying performers in luminous costumes.

The **Grand Finale Parade** takes place on 4 November (Sunday). Starting at 2:20pm at the Central Lawn in Victoria Park, it moves onto Great George Street, East Point Road and back. This magical day-time parade, created and led by 700 young people and professional artists, features 12 4-metre tall giant puppets inspired by favourite Oz characters, including the Wicked Witch of the West, Glinda the Good Witch of the North, the monstrous Kalidahs, the mischievous Flying Monkeys and many more.

This year, local artist Paul Chan brings the Cowardly Lion to life as a giant inflatable illuminated puppet that incorporates 500 LED light bulbs. Fabricated in lightweight windbreaker material, the puppet weighs just 1kg – despite standing 3.8 metres tall when inflated! Operating the Cowardly Lion from inside the puppet, Chan hopes to impress the crowd as he pounces their way!



The Tin Man will also take to the streets, reimagined by Taiwanese artist Jimmy Hsieh as a giant puppet measuring 4 metres in height! Made from recycled waste materials such as corrugated boards and strips of fibreglass, the Tin Man has more than 1,200 LED light bulbs worked into his body. He also weighs 8kg and requires 3 puppeteers to make him move! Hsieh is looking forward to seeing the excitement on people's faces as this giant metal hero comes marching towards them!

Education and the Arts Rolled into One

Standard Chartered Arts in the Park is an annual education programme that helps young people in Hong Kong improve their self-confidence and enhance important life skills such as creativity, teamwork and problem-solving through the arts. The six-month programme culminates in a two-day festival in November. Every year, over 3,500 participants from Hong Kong's schools and youth organisations work with professional artists, flexing their creative muscles to produce vibrant costumes and giant puppets for two spectacular street parades, and a variety of stage performances and art stalls. After months of hard work, the stunning results are celebrated with the city at an exciting, inclusive community festival. By providing participants with exciting opportunities in the arts, *Standard Chartered Arts in the Park* contributes towards the long-term creative development of Hong Kong's youth.

Inspired by London's *Notting Hill Carnival* and Brazil's *Rio de Janeiro Carnival, Standard Chartered Arts in the Park* first took place in 2001 at Stanley Plaza. That year, the parade consisted of a few hundred participants. Since then, the event has become the largest outdoor youth arts festival in Hong Kong, moving to its current location in Causeway Bay's Victoria Park in 2008. In 2012, the Grand Finale Parade extended its route from Victoria Park onto the streets of Causeway Bay. In 2013 we held the first illuminated Night Parade, offering visitors an enchanting new experience.
