Telling Hong Kong Stories through Shutter Art HK Urban Canvas 2019

Discovering local history in Kowloon City and Ap Lei Chau

(2 April 2019, Hong Kong) – This year, to find out how traditional neighbourhood shops have adapted to the changes that have taken place over the years, and to explore the local food culture and history, *HK Urban Canvas* visits Ap Lei Chau and Kowloon City.

22 new shopfront shutter artworks and more

Organised by Hong Kong Youth Arts Foundation (HKYAF) and powered by Standard Chartered Bank (Hong Kong) Limited, *HK Urban Canvas* is a community art project that enhances community inclusion and highlights unique aspects of local culture through art and oral history. Launched in 2017, the project has created 62 shopfront shutter artworks in 6 districts to celebrate Hong Kong's local history and collective memories. Each year, the project is divided into two phases. The main focus of phase one is public art. This year, 22 new shopfront shutter artworks were created by 9 groups of local artists. Each work reflects the history of Ap Lei Chau and Kowloon City and the personalities and histories of the shop owners. The focus of phase two is art education. This year we were joined by hundreds of students. Working with local artists and their teachers, the students created 260 pieces of artwork inspired by the history and local stories of Ap Lei Chau and Kowloon City, and highlighting the contributions of our community neighbours. The resulting artworks will be showcased in the *HK Urban Canvas 2019* exhibitions at Aberdeen Promenade and Kowloon City Plaza in April. During the

exhibition period, HKYAF also presents guided cultural tours of the shutter artworks, and an updated version of the *HK Urban Canvas* mobile app will be available for download.

Discover the cultural heritage of Kowloon City and Ap Lei Chau

In previous years, *HK Urban Canvas* has explored the neighbourhoods of Central and Western District, Wan Chai, Sham Shui Po, Mong Kok and Yau Ma Tei. This year the project explored Ap Lei Chau and Kowloon City to uncover the traces of local heritage and traditional shops that continue to exist despite the changes that have taken place in both neighbourhoods.

Kowloon City is a culinary destination for authentic Thai, Chiu Chow and Cantonese cuisine. Fong Wing Kee Hot Pot Restaurant, a neighbourhood favourite among local residents and visitors, is famed for its rich, flavourful satay hot pot broth. Initially established in the 1950s, the business started as a humble noodle stall. In the 1980s it was relocated to Hau Wong Road and expanded into a hot pot restaurant. Since Fong Wing Kee opened, there have been many changes in the neighbourhood, including the demolition of Kowloon Walled City in 1993 and the closure of Kai Tak Airport in 1998. The shutter artwork, created by local artist Devil, shows Fong Wing Kee's legacy in three snapshots. The image on the right shows the owner Mr Fong pointing at a vintage photograph of Kowloon Walled City, where his father's original stall was located. The centre image shows a bowl of soup being prepared at the noodle stall. The image on the left shows people enjoying hot pot in the current shop today.

Before urbanisation and the construction of the road bridge, **Ap Lei Chau** was a sparsely populated island with small coastal and floating village communities living along the northern shore. When fishermen are working, they often spend weeks or months at sea. To prepare for long periods away from land, they pack stocks of all the food and everyday items they need while they are away, including emergency supplies of Chinese medicine. **Ching Hing Wine Medicine Company** was opened in 1975 by Dr Chan and his wife to supply the local fishing community with Chinese medicine and traditional herbal remedies. All the raw ingredients are hand-prepared by the couple themselves through time-consuming processes like slicing, smoking and drying. The shutter artwork is inspired by their tenacious spirit and hard work. It shows the couple in their pharmacy with their pet dog – Dr Chan preparing prescriptions and Mrs Chan grinding herbs with a pestle and mortar – and both with contented smiles on their faces.

Learn about local history with our free guided cultural tours

From 13 to 28 April, alongside the exhibitions of student artwork, HKYAF will also run *HK Urban Canvas 2019* guided cultural tours to explore the local history and community stories of Kowloon City and Ap Lei Chau. The programme includes a total of 24 tours. Each tour is approx. 1 hour long and can accommodate up to 15 participants. In mid-April, to accompany the tours, we also launch an updated version of the *HK Urban Canvas* mobile app complete with the new tour routes for Kowloon City and Ap Lei Chau. The updated app features 6 districts, 10 tour routes, local shop stories and images of all shutter artworks produced since the project started in 2017. The app also has an augmented reality (AR) function that allows users to view the artworks any time, even when the shops are open and the shutters are not visible.

HK Urban Canvas 2019 Free Guided Cultural Tours

- The Kowloon City Guided Cultural Tour starts at Kowloon City Plaza, and explores signature food dishes at local eateries and other food and lifestyle cultures through unique local stories behind the shopfront shutter artworks, and discovers the historical traces of Kowloon Walled City, pre-war Cantonese shophouses and more local cultural highlights in the neighbourhood.
- The Ap Lei Chau Guided Cultural Tour begins at Hung Shing Temple, where old fishing villages settled nearby, and explores the old streets and local shops of Ap Lei Chau, discovering unique stories and customs behind Hong Kong's traditional fishing communities.
