HKYAF's Flagship Original Theatre Production Miller Performing Arts: I'mperfect

Let's embrace and accept our imperfections

(5 October 2022, Hong Kong) – At some point in our lives, most of us will dream of having a perfect body, a perfect life. While the online world tempts us to project ourselves in an ideal light, there can also be real-world consequences. But maybe we can find self-acceptance by simply changing our perspective.

Between 10 and 12 November, an all-girls cast featuring 35 of Hong Kong's most talented young actors and dancers storm the stage at the Hong Kong Arts Centre with *l'mperfect* – the final production in our original multimedia theatre trilogy. Proudly presented by Hong Kong Youth Arts Foundation (HKYAF), and written and directed by HKYAF founder **Lindsey McAlister**, *l'mperfect* explores body image issues, online personas and real-life identities through theatre, dance, music and video.

The third production in a trilogy on social issues affecting young people today

In November 2020, Lindsey McAlister presented the theatre production #hashtag about the deceptive world of social media. This was followed in November 2021 by *Only a Girl*, a bittersweet LGBT+ tale about a girl's road to self-discovery. The positive response that both productions received from younger audiences, teachers and parents alike motivated Lindsey to create a third work, *l'mperfect*.

The last production in our trilogy on social issues affecting young people today, *l'mperfect* explores body image issues. Seeing the role that social media plays in shaping teenage views and unnatural body norms, Lindsey wanted to highlight the importance of body positivity and self-acceptance. "Body image struggles affect people of all ages, genders and cultures, but teenagers may find it more difficult to overcome unrealistic beauty standards," said Lindsey. Working with health experts to ensure the authenticity of the work, Lindsey touches on body image issues that receive less public attention and hopes to encourage all of us to accept ourselves for who we are.

Spark meaningful conversations around body image issues

Sharing similar views, director's assistant 16-year-old Emilia Kate Oliver expressed her excitement about working on the project: "I've constantly been learning about my body and how to appreciate it. I've definitely had my fair share of body image issues, and that really made me want to spark conversations about it in a more creative way." She believes the production was the perfect opportunity to share her thoughts, and help peers with body insecurities know that they are not alone.

HKYAF youth choreographers work alongside the professional creative team

Most of the dance segments in *l'mperfect* are choreographed by young choreographers Jasmine Royer, Valerie Cheung and Zoé Wong. Nurtured during HKYAF's Youth Assistant Choreographers programme, they worked alongside the professional creative team during the development of the show. Eighteen-year-old Valerie Chung, who was also part of the team for *#hashtag* and *Only a Girl*, said that she was always eager to work with the dancers in HKYAF. On promoting self-acceptance, Valerie said: "You own your own body. Unless you want to listen to others, you can stay how you are and be confident with your own body."
