(10 November 2022, Hong Kong) Nineteenth-century British writer Charles Dickens – known for his intricate tales about the struggles and hardships of life – produced some of the most widely-read books of all time. This year, our annual youth arts festival *Standard Chartered Arts in the Park* takes inspiration from four of his works – *A Christmas Carol, Oliver Twist, David Copperfield* and *Great Expectations* – offering a colourful glimpse into his resourceful and fascinating characters. Join us on 3 and 4 December for a spectacular weekend of Dickensian Christmas cheer!

Organised by Hong Kong Youth Arts Foundation, sponsored by Standard Chartered Community Foundation and powered by Standard Chartered Bank (Hong Kong) Limited, *Standard Chartered Arts in the Park* is Hong Kong's largest outdoor youth arts carnival. Now in its 22nd year, the annual event which are free and open to participants of all ages brings joy and laughter to over 190,000 visitors and helps young participants develop important life skills such as creativity, teamwork, problem-solving, leadership and self-confidence. This year, alongside two days of outdoor events in the Art Park, the programme also includes a five-day programme of online activities to get everyone in a week-long festive spirit!

Four-metre-tall Giant Puppets Inspired by Characters from Dickens

On 3 and 4 December, the two-day carnival transforms the West Kowloon Cultural District Art Park into nineteenth-century Victorian England, with colourful visual arts and performing arts activities and exciting performances. At 2:30pm on both days, the highly anticipated Giant Puppet and Dramatic Costume Showcase takes place in the Art Park. Created and led by six local professional artists and 60 local secondary students, the showcase features 11



four-metre-tall giant puppets – each inspired by a character from the works of Charles Dickens and taking an average of 200 hours of work to create. The giant characters include the miserly businessman Scrooge from *A Christmas Carol*, the cunning master thief Fagin from *Oliver Twist*, Wilkins Micawber the eternal optimist from *David Copperfield*, and old Miss Havisham from *Great Expectations*, who was jilted on her wedding day and lived the rest of her life in her wedding dress. Also in the showcase are 400 students and performing groups sharing over 170 vibrant creative costumes and artworks. Bring a camera and be ready to be amazed!

Other exciting events include eleven interactive art stalls, stage performances, storytelling theatre, storytelling, a capella performances, African drum jams, circus workshops, large-scale installations featuring 9,000 circle weaving artworks created by Standard Chartered volunteers and students, and a giant puppet photo area for capturing fun moments with family and friends.

Twelve Creative Online Arts Programmes



In view of the overwhelming response to the online and outdoor activities last year, from 28 November to 2 December, to get everyone in a festive mood in the run-up to the carnival weekend, we also present our popular weeklong programme of online arts activities. This year, Standard Chartered Arts in the Park offers a collection of 12 guided visual arts and performing arts programmes on the official website (www.scartsinthepark.com) and the

The free-of-charge festive activities include storytelling theatre performances, a dance performance, a face painting tutorial, DIY activities featuring paper puppets and a festive face mask, plus festive gift wrapping ideas and more – all designed to help children get creative at home with the family at any time!

In line with the government's anti-pandemic measures and to ensure the safety of the public and staff, visitors are required to undergo temperature screening, scan the "LeaveHomeSafe" QR code, wear face masks and comply with all hygiene measures implemented by the organiser. About Standard Chartered Arts in the Park

Standard Chartered Arts in the Park (AIP) is an annual youth education programme through the arts. The six-month programme provides participants with exciting opportunities that help improve their self-confidence and enhance important life skills such as creativity, team spirit and leadership. Every year, the programme culminates in a two-day, free admission family-oriented arts carnival that nurtures positivity, creativity and appreciation of Hong Kong's talented youth.

Launched in 2001, Standard Chartered Arts in the Park first took place at Stanley Plaza. Since then, the event has become the largest outdoor youth arts festival in Hong Kong, moving to Victoria Park in Causeway Bay in 2008. In 2012, the Grand Finale Parade expanded out of the park and onto the streets of Causeway Bay, and in 2013 the very first illuminated Night Parade took place. In 2020, a week-long online programme was launched to help children get creative at home. Each year, over 3,500 young people come together with local and overseas organisations to produce vibrant costumes and giant puppets for spectacular street parades, plus a variety of stage performances and art stalls, attracting over 190,000 visitors annually.
